

Dear Falcon Fan

Welcome to your United States Air Force Academy (USAFA) and the beautiful city of Colorado Springs. We are very proud of our world-class facilities and venues and are excited to share them with you. Thank you for taking the time to come out and support our incredibly talented cadet-athletes as they compete on the "fields of friendly strife"!

USAFA competes as a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in 27 different sports. We also field two non-NCAA affiliated sports, boxing and cheerleading, which brings our total sports offered to 29.

The majority of our teams compete in the Mountain West Conference, while others compete in conferences such as the Atlantic Hockey Association and the Mountain Pacific Sport Federation, to name a few. Regardless of which conference our teams are associated with, they all compete against numerous non-conference opponents, many that are nationally ranked, with special emphasis on our sister service academies.

In addition to cheering on your Falcons, we encourage you to visit the Air Force Academy Gift Shop, located inside the Barry Goldwater Visitor Center, as well as the many friendly businesses that support Air Force athletics in the local community.

U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY

The Air Force Academy became a reality on April 1, 1954, when President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the bill establishing it as a separate service academy. In 1954, Harold E. Talbott, then Secretary of the Air Force, appointed a commission to assist him in selecting the permanent site. Secretary Talbott selected the site near Colorado Springs over 580 proposed sites in 45 states.

The first USAFA class entered in July 1955 at temporary facilities at Lowry Air Force Base, Denver, Colo. Construction of the permanent location started in 1955 and the cadet wing moved into its permanent home in late August 1958. The first class was commissioned as second lieutenants in June 1959.

There were 206 members in the first class. Five years later, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed a bill into law authorizing an increase in the number of cadets in the cadet wing from 2,529 to 4,417.

The Visitor Center's hours are 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. daily, with the exception of Christmas and New Year's Day. All profits from our Gift Shop directly support our cadet-athletes

We believe strongly in the benefits of athletic competition and recognize that you, our loyal fans, help enhance the mission of developing leaders of character for our Air Force and our nation. Again, thank you for your support of Falcon Athletics.

President Gerald R. Ford signed legislation on Oct. 7, 1975, that permitted women to enter the nation's military academies. Women entered the Air Force Academy for the first time on June 28, 1976, and that class graduated in May 1980. Throughout its history, one theme has been constant and persistent -- a "Commitment to Excellence."



EVENT SECURITY POLICIES

The safety and security of our fans are our primary concerns on game day; therefore, the Event Security staff may request inspection of all bags for entrance into all our athletic venues. Patrons may refuse to have a bag inspected and choose instead to return the bag/item to their vehicle or choose not to be granted admittance to the event. (Note: No ticket refunds will be given.)

ITEMS PROHIBITED IN ALL ATHLETIC VENUES:

Alcoholic beverages; artificial noisemakers of any kind; backpacks to include bota bags, wine-skins and camelbacks; bags larger than 8x11 inches; hard-sided containers; banners or large signs (no signs any larger than hand-held poster 18"x24"); food or drink (the Cadet Gymnasium is the exception); glass containers or cans; items that cannot be readily inspected; items deemed unsafe by security personnel; laser pointers; pets (other than working service dogs); sticks, poles or umbrellas; weapons, firearms or fireworks; and flash photography.

ITEMS PERMITTED IN ALL ATHLETIC VENUES: Infant carrier packs and diaper bags (if the infant is present); handheld video cameras; factory-sealed transparent soft plastic water bottles, 24 oz. or less; and empty transparent soft plastic bottles, 24 oz. or less.

The Directorate of Athletics thanks all patrons for their cooperation with these policies so that every fan can have a safe and secure game experience.



Falcon Stadium

At an elevation of 6,621 feet, Falcon Stadium has been a fixture on the Rampart Range landscape since Sept. 22, 1962, when a then-overflow crowd of 41,350 saw the Air Force football team win the game versus in-state rival Colorado State, 24-0.

Prior to the 2006 season, a state-of-the-art surface, FieldTurfTM replaced the previous mix of Kentucky Blue and rye grasses that were planted in 1996. The change from grass to FieldTurf was primarily for athlete safety. The new turf covers 84,480 square feet with an additional 26,520 square feet of natural grass surrounding it. Falcon Stadium currently has a seating capacity of 46,692.



DIRECTIONS TO FALCON STADIUM

For Lots 1, 2 and 3: Take Interstate 25 to the South Gate exit (#150); Take South Gate Boulevard to Stadium Boulevard and proceed to your designated parking lot. For Lots 4, 5 and 6 and the Blue/Silver area in Lots 5 and 6: Take Interstate 25 to the North Gate exit (#156B); Take a left (south) on Stadium Boulevard; and, follow the signs for your designated parking lot. For parking lot designation, see Page 5.

FALCON STADIUM ENTRANCE POLICIES

The USAFA entrance gates (North and South) open four hours prior to kickoff and remain open to the public three hours following the game. Stadium gates and ticket booths open two hours prior to kickoff. All persons and personal belongings entering the stadium are subject to search. Please see Event Security Policies on this page for a list of items prohibited and authorized in our athletic venues. Exit and re-entry into the stadium will only be permitted through gates 1, 6 and 9 where a hand stamp will be provided for reentry. Storage of prohibited items is not provided.

DISABILITY PARKING ACCOMMODATIONS

Special parking for handicapped patrons is available at the front of Lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 and at Gates 5, 6 and 7. Parking is strictly firstcome, first-served. See locations on the map on Page 5. A handicapped shuttle service is available two hours prior to kickoff. Handicapped patrons may catch the shuttle in front of Lot 3. Shuttle service provides handicapped patrons with service directly to Gates 3, 5 and 7 on the south side of the stadium and Gates 4. 6 and 8 on the north side. Postgame shuttle service operates immediately following the game and will transport handicapped patrons back to Lot 3, see page 3. Service during the game is on a case-by-case basis.

FALCON STADIUM INFORMATION

ANIMALS

Only working service dogs are permitted.

ATM/CREDIT CARDS

There are no ATMs located in Falcon Stadium. Tickets and souvenirs can be purchased with checks, cash or credit cards. Food and beverages can also be purchased with credit cards (except Discover or American Express) and cash.

BICYCLES

Bicycles are prohibited at the stadium or on Stadium Boulevard on game days.

DISABILITY SEATING

Call the Athletic Ticket Office at (719) 472-1895 or (800) 666-USAF (8723) for any handicapped seating requests. Wheelchair seating is also available; please contact the Athletic Ticket Office for seating. Wheelchair reserved seating is available behind Sections L6, L10 and L13. General admission wheelchair seating is available behind Section L3 (lowest/west side). General admission seating space is strictly first-come, first-served. See seating map on Page 5. Wheelchairs are not available.

DoD CARDHOLDER EXPRESS LINE

A DoD cardholder express line is available at Gate 2a for those spectators entering Falcon Stadium with DoD identification and game ticket. All entry restrictions apply. All cadets must have their military ID card.

EXPRESS LINE

All patrons who have nothing to be searched are eligible for the Express Line located at each gate.

FALCON PRIDE CLUB TAILGATING

Let us do all the work for you! The official Air Force tailgate is held under our 100' x 140' tent located directly east of Falcon Stadium in the Falcon Fan Fest area. The tailgating tent has the capacity to hold up to 2,000 people and includes catered meals from local Colorado Springs restaurants, beverages from Pepsi and Budweiser, visits from The Bird and Air Force cheerleaders, music, inflatable games for the kids, and face painting (\$25/person).

The official Air Force tailgate welcomes alumni, parents and families of our cadet-athletes, and all fans to food and fun before the big game (opens two hours prior to kickoff). FIRST AID

In case of an emergency, notify the nearest usher or security personnel. Emergency Medical Teams are located throughout the stadium for your assistance.

FOOD & BEVERAGE STANDS

Food & Beverage stands are located on each concourse level throughout the stadium. A variety of food venues are available providing a range of items such as: chicken, bratwurst, hamburgers, French fries, funnel cakes and other specialty items.

PRE-GAME ACTIVITIES CADET MARCH-ON

The Cadet Wing marches onto the field and into the cadet seating areas 20 minutes before game time.

FLY-OVERS

Fly-overs, conditions permitting, are announced before the start of each game.

WINGS OF BLUE PARACHUTE TEAM

Conditions permitting, the Wings of Blue, the Air Force Academy parachute team, will jump into Falcon Stadium prior to kickoff.

GAME PROGRAMS & SEATBACK RENTALS

Game programs are sold before and during football games inside gate entrances. Seatbacks are available for rent inside gate entrances.

GIFT SHOPS

A wide variety of Air Force and USAFA merchandise can be purchased at stands located within Falcon Stadium.

GROUP TAILGATING

Groups interested in reserving a tailgating space for either the season or individual games, please see the tailgate guide located on our web site at www.GoAirForceFalcons.com and complete a reservation form or call the Events Management Office at (719) 333-9537. One parking pass is issued per tailgate space. The reserved tailgate spaces are outlined in each lot designated on the parking map on Page 5. Corporate or individual groups will need to contact the Athletics' Marketing Office at (719) 333-2626.

INDIVIDUAL TAILGATING

Tailgating by individuals is also allowed in the general parking lot areas, but must not interfere with adjacent parking spaces or thoroughfares.

PARKING FEES/INFORMATION

All parking is free. Please refer to the map on Page 5 for parking areas. Parking lots open four hours before the game. All parking lots must be cleared three hours after game conclusion. There is no overnight parking in the stadium parking lots, to include RVs and motor homes, before or after games.

PUBLIC ADDRESS ANNOUNCEMENTS

General public announcements will not be made over the public address system except under extraordinary circumstances. Requests of an emergency nature should be addressed to the nearest usher or security personnel.

Public address announcements are made regularly during the game to instruct parents and children who have been separated to meet underneath the scoreboard located at the south end of Falcon Stadium.

RESTROOMS/ BABY-CHANGING STATIONS

Restrooms are located throughout the stadium below the Press Box, at sections M3, M14, L3 and L13, and at Gates 1 and 2. All restrooms are handicapped accessible. There are baby-changing stations in the restrooms throughout Falcon Stadium.

SMOKING

Smoking is not permitted inside Falcon Stadium.

TELEPHONES

No pay phones are available at Falcon Stadium. However, the use of cellular phones is permitted as long as their use does not interfere with or disturb other fans and their ability to enjoy the event.


TICKET WILL CALL



Falcon Stadium Seating and Parking





The Cadet Field House is considered to be one of the premier sports structures in the country. The three-inone building was completed in the spring of 1968. It was designed for intercollegiate competition and practice in track, basketball, and ice hockey. Approximately one-half of the building is a multipurpose area contain-

ing a one-sixth mile, six-lane tartan surface track with a synthetic turf surfaced infield, approximately the size of a standard football field. The netted area is approximately the size of a baseball infield and is an ideal practice area for the varsity baseball and lacrosse teams. The multipurpose area is used for indoor track and field meets,

inclement weather practice sessions for all outdoor varsity sports, instructional golf classes, aerobics conditioning and fitness testing.

Clune Arena has a seating capacity of 5,858, while the Cadet Ice Arena seats 2,502. Clune Arena is also used for basketball, wrestling and boxing events.

The Falcon Athletic Center (FAC), which was part of a military construction project, totals 161,000 square feet and includes one of the premier strength-training facilities in the nation. The building opened in July 2003.

The FAC houses new sports medicine and weight training facilities, as well as a new football locker room, football team meeting facilities and equipment and storage issue facility. In addition, the athletic administration and football program personnel have offices in the FAC.

The Athletic Hall of Excellence is housed on the main level (3rd floor) and honors USAFA graduates who excelled in physical education, intramurals and intercollegiate athletics and who have gone on to achieve significant postgraduate leadership positions.

DIRECTIONS TO CADET FIELD HOUSE

Take Interstate 25 to the North Gate exit (#156B); Take the second left turn (Parade Loop) after entering USAFA, then turn right on to Field House Drive; Follow Field House Drive to the east parking lot of the Cadet Field House. Clune Arena, Cadet Ice Arena, and the indoor track multipurpose area are located inside the Cadet Field House.

CADET FIELD HOUSE ENTRANCE POLICIES

The Cadet Field House and ticket booths will open one hour prior to the start of an event. All persons and personal belongings entering the Cadet Field House are subject to search. Please see page 2 for a list of items allowed and prohibited in the Cadet Field House during events. Exit and re-entry into the Cadet Field House will be permitted through the main entrance (where a hand stamp will be provided for re-entry).

CADET FIELD HOUSE INFORMATION

ANIMALS

Only working service dogs are permitted in the Cadet Field House. No pets or other animals are permitted.

ATM/CREDIT CARDS

There is no ATM located in the Cadet Field House. Tickets and merchandise can be purchased with credit cards, cash and checks. Food & beverages can be purchased with credit cards (except Discover and American Express) and cash.



BICYCLES/ROLLERBLADES & SKATEBOARDS

No bicycles, rollerblades or skateboards are allowed in the Cadet Field House or around the surrounding facility.

CADET SEATING

In Clune Arena, the cadet wing has reserved seating in: L18-L20 and U26-U28. In the Ice Arena, cadet seating sections are OO and NN.

FOOD & BEVERAGE STANDS

A food & beverage stand is located on the main concourse level of the

Cadet Field House along with a variety of food venues. A secondary food & beverage stand is open on the west side of the Cadet Field House during heavily attended events.

DISABILITY PARKING ACCOMMODATIONS

Special parking for disabled patrons is available at the front of the Cadet Field House in the southeast parking lot. Parking is strictly first-come, first-served. A ramp for wheelchair access is located at the southwest corner of the Cadet Field House.



DISABILITY SEATING

To request seating for disabled patrons, please call the Athletic Ticket Office at (719) 472-1895 or (800) 666-USAF (8723). Wheelchair assistance is not available.

DoD CARDHOLDER EXPRESS LINES

A DoD cardholder express line is available for those spectators entering the Cadet Field House with DoD identification and game ticket. All entry restrictions still apply. All cadets must have their military ID card and a game ticket (men's basketball and hockey) to enter the Cadet Field House. Only cadets are allowed to enter with backpacks, but are subject to search.

FIRST AID

In case of an emergency, notify the nearest usher/security personnel.

GAME PROGRAMS

Game programs are on sale in the center concourse of the Cadet Field House.

GIFT SHOP





Cadet Gymnasium

The Cadet Gymnasium is not your typical "gym" as the name implies. It is the standard by which multipurpose athletic complexes are judged across the nation. The building contains an Olympic size pool; water polo pool; gymnastics room; wrestling and boxing rooms; rifle range; squash courts; racquetball/handball courts; a multipurpose area for boxing, weight training, fencing and judo classes; four indoor tennis courts; and three gymnasiums which can be used for such activities as basketball, tennis or volleyball.

The Cadet Gymnasium is used for physical education classes, intramural and intercollegiate practice/competition. The two swimming pools cover almost 20,000 square feet of the facility. The water polo pool (7,154 square feet) is primarily used by the water polo team for practice and competition.

The Olympic pool (11,928 square feet) has an 18-foot diving well and is equipped with two one-meter boards, two three-meter boards as well as a five-meter and a 10-meter platform. The Olympic pool seats more than 800 spectators.

In addition to the indoor facilities, on the south side of the gym are outdoor tennis courts, basketball and team handball courts.

Outdoor facilities associated with the gym include 57 athletic fields (143 acres) for intercollegiate and intramural sports, two baseball diamonds, a 400-meter all-weather track stadium, a varsity soccer stadium that seats more than 1,000 fans and restroom facilities.

The Cadet Lacrosse Stadium is an artificial turf stadium located north of the Cadet Gymnasium which seats 2,000 for home games.



DIRECTIONS TO THE CADET GYMNASIUM

Take Interstate 25 to the North Gate exit (#156B); Take the second left turn (Parade Loop) after entering USAFA, then turn right on to Field House Drive; Follow Field House Drive to the east parking lot of the Cadet Field House. The Cadet Gymnasium is located west of the Cadet Field House and the Falcon Athletic Center.

ENTRANCE POLICIES

The Cadet Gymnasium and ticket booths will open one hour before the start of the event. All persons and personal belongings entering the Cadet Gymnasium are subject to search. Cadets are allowed to enter with backpacks, but are subject to search. Please see page 2 for a list of items prohibited in the Cadet Gymnasium during events.



Food & beverages are available for selected outdoor events and are provided through portable trailers.


GAME PROGRAMS
